## WATER RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT YEAR-ROUND per FRASER MUNICIPAL CODE

This is a brief summary of the water conservation measures outlined in the Municipal Code:

- 1) Outside watering and irrigation is strictly prohibited between the hours of 9 AM and 5 PM. Hand-held watering by hose and watering canister during this time is allowed; but is not encouraged.
- 2) Timers are strongly recommended on all irrigation systems and hoses, with a time setting not to exceed 30 minutes per rotation. Rain sensors on such systems are also recommended.
- 3) Washing cars, boats, campers, windows, and the like, shall be done only when the hose is equipped with a flow restricting device such as a trigger nozzle (an example is shown at right).

As a result of two meetings to date, based on the rankings and the discussion of the options, the Town will continue its further study of prioritized options, which will be included in the final county-wide strategy.

### MEET THE BOARD MEMBER - PARNELL QUINN
