

### Police Department 2016/2017 Comparison

Our Fraser/Winter Park Police Department handled 25% more calls for service in 2017 vs 2016 (5198 calls vs 4162 calls), which is a significant increase. Below is a graph displaying these increases in activity by category. The "Other" category represents traffic citations such as for speeding, and failure to yield along with littering, medical/injury calls, abandoned vehicles, and just general "information reports". We have seen increases in just about every category with noticeable increases in burglary, theft, DUIs, and traffic citations.

We'd like to send a huge thank you to Chief Trainor and the Fraser/Winter Park Police Department for their outstanding service and continued dedication to our community.

## Public Works

### Water

The Water-Wastewater Committee met Tuesday, January 9th, where staff presented the 2018 Byers Avenue Waterline Replacement Project. It was the Committee's recommendation to move forward with the final engineering design, preparation of the contract documents and placing the project out for bid. Once bids are received and reviewed, we will bring the Board a recommendation for approval for the expenditure of budgeted funds for this 2018 project.

### Streets

Our Public Works has nearly completed moving all equipment and materials from the old utility/snow storage site to their new location just south of the Fraser Cemetery. We are now ready to begin excavation and site work for "The Drop" aka our new Recycling and Pay-As-You-Throw (PAYT) Facility.

Public Works has one vacant full-time Equipment Operator/Laborer position left to fill.



## Bird's Nest Condos

We are pleased to report that we have resolved the "illegal apartment" matter at Birds Nest Condos on Wolverine Lane after almost a year and a half. The unit has been unoccupied during this time, and will remain unoccupied until the owners complete some interior repairs. The owners contracted a surveyor to research the history and after working with the Town Attorney, it was determined that at the time the condominiums were developed, this unit was anticipated and approved. However, some of the paperwork had never been completed. At this time, the unit has been established as legitimate and utility service fees in arrears have been paid.
